About the competition

With the *Snowy Valleys Sculpture Trail* on Tumbarumba's doorstep, be inspired to get your creative juices flowing and create a sculpture for the 2023 Tumbarumba Spring Flower Festival. We are calling all artists, young and old, to showcase your skills and transform ordinary materials into works of art. Whether you are an experienced sculptor or a budding enthusiast, this competition welcomes all levels of expertise.

Embrace the "*Buttons and Butterflies*" theme (see below) if it inspires you, but don't hesitate to follow your creative instincts if you have another idea in mind. This competition celebrates both themed and non-themed sculptures, inviting a diverse range of artistic expression. We look forward to seeing your unique creations!"

The theme

"Buttons and Butterflies".

Step into the captivating world of *Buttons and Butterflies* at this year's festival. Inspired by the local Button Hut at the Pioneer Women's Hut and the abundance of butterflies in spring, we encourage you to sculpt pieces that capture the essence of these enchanting subjects and bring vibrancy to the festival.

Entry fee

An exhibit fee of \$5 per sculpture for the open section; Free for high school and primary school entrants.

Guidelines

- Everyone is welcome to enter the Sculpture Competition. The most important rule is to enjoy yourselves.
- A sculpture can be made of any material or combination of materials.
- Sculptures do **not** have to be based on the theme “*Buttons and Butterflies*”. Entrants should indicate on their entry form if they wish to be considered for “Best representation of theme”.
- Sculptures will be the work of the person/s entering the competition. Group entries are welcome.
- Sculptures should have been made in the past 2 years and not previously entered in the Tumbarumba Spring Flower Festivals. Previous works may be considered for exhibition only at the discretion of the organisers.
- The Tumbarumba Spring Flower Festival takes all care but no responsibility for exhibits. They will not be held responsible for any damage to property caused by the creation, installation, or insecurity of sculptures.
- Entries and exhibits in the festival may be offered for sale. The festival charges a 10% commission.
- Photographs of sculptures will be used for publicity and promotion purposes.
- Entrants are responsible for delivery, installation, and collection of sculptures.
- Sculptures will be displayed indoors where possible. If you require an outdoor space, please advise the organisers prior to the event. Any sculpture displayed outdoors must be secured in a manner that does not blow away and will not otherwise be a danger to or cause possible injury to anyone. The Festival will not be responsible for the security of exhibits displayed outdoors.
- Winners will be announced, and presentations will be made at the Basketball Stadium at the Tumbarumba Showgrounds on Sunday 29 October 2023 at 2pm.

How to enter

- Complete a registration form for each exhibit. These can be obtained from the Tumbarumba Visitor Information Centre, Tumbarumba Bikes and Blooms, via the Tumbarumba Spring Flower Festival Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/TumbarumbaSpringFlowerFestival/> and website (www.tumbarumbagardenclub.com).
- Decide if you would like to offer your creation for sale and indicate an expected price.
- Email your registration form to Elvie at elvieyates01@gmail.com or Joan at joan.macdonald@hotmail.com or take it to the Tumbarumba Visitor Information Centre by Monday 23 October.
- Bring your sculpture to the Basketball Stadium at the Tumbarumba Showgrounds on Friday 27 October between 10am and 5pm for installation. If your sculpture involves a special installation, discuss your requirements with the curator of the exhibit. You will be responsible for the installation.
