CLASS 1 - BEARDED IRIS

- A One self colour—White
- B One self colour—Blue
- C One self colour—Pink
- D One self colour—Yellow
- E One self colour—Peach/Apricot/Orange
- F One self colour—Brown/Red hues
- G One self colour—Mauve/Purple
- H One self colour—Black
- I One bicolour
- J One blend
- K Plicata edged
- L Heritage – any colour/variety
- M One Beardless Iris—any other variety

CLASS 2 - RHODODENDRONS

- A Single Head of rhodo—White
- B Single Head of rhodo—Pink—Strong
- C Single Head of rhodo—Pink—Pale
- D Single Head of rhodo—Mauve
- E Single Head of rhodo—Purple
- F Single Head of rhodo—Red
- G Single Head of rhodo—Yellow

CLASS 3 -AZALEA

- A One stem of azalea—White
- B One stem of azalea—Pink
- C One stem of azalea—Pink/White
- D One stem of azalea—Red
- E One stem of azalea—Mauve/Purple
- F Mollis azalea, one stem—white
- G Mollis azalea, one stem, Orange
- H Mollis azalea, one stem—Yellow
- I Mollis azalea, one stem Pink
- J Mollis azalea, one stem Red
- K One stem kalmia

CLASS 4 - FLORAL DESIGN**

- A Spring symphony
- B Fantasy in monochrome (*only one colour flower to be used – different shades of chosen colour to be used*)
- C Wildflower whimsy – *Native flowers & foliage (may include gumnuts, bark, grasses etc)*
- D No flowers allowed – *Foliage only*
- E Rough with the smooth
- F Boxed in
- G Sticks, stones & succulents
- H Dinosaur garden (9 years and under)
- I Fairy garden (9 years & under)
- J Flower power! (12 years & under)

** Rules for FLORAL DESIGN entries

1. Floral material must predominate
2. All mechanics such as oasis foam, pins etc must be covered

- B One self colour—Pink

- F One self colour —Mauve / Blue
- G One self colour —Apricot

- J One David Austin or old-fashioned rose
- K One cluster rose

- A Collection of spring flowering bulbs
- B Collection of spring flowers
- C Collection of columbines
- D Container of annuals, one variety
- E One clematis in bowl
- F Clematis (collection of 3)
- G Plate of pansies
- H One head of geranium
- I Three different geraniums
- J One single peony
- K One double peony
- L Tree peony
- M Three different peony
- N Cut of Hippeastrum
- O Cut of flower not mentioned

CLASS 7 - SHRUBS & SPIKES

- A Cut of orchid
- B Cut of flowering shrub
- C Cut of native flowering shrub
- D Most unusual flower
- E Spike of delphinium
- F Spike of foxglove
- G Spike of lupin

CLASS 8 - POT PLANTS & CACTI

Size of pots no more than 25cm at top

- A Pot plant in flower
- B Potted bulb in flower
- C Pot plant—Foliage
- D Pot plant variegated leaf
- E Potted fern
- F Potted cacti—single
- G Potted cacti—multi
- H Strap cacti
- I Zygo cacti
- J Potted succulent
- K Potted geranium
- L Bonsai
